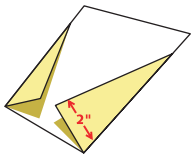


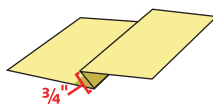

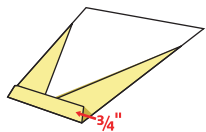
Fold a record-breaking paper flier! This glider is the current king of the paper airplane world. Originally folded by paper pilot Ken Blackburn, it claims the Guinness record of 27.6 seconds aloft! Think you can beat that? Give it a shot -- the sky's the limit.



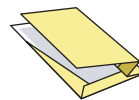
1. Fold 2 corners of an 8 1/2- by 11-inch sheet of paper about 2 inches toward the center, lengthwise, so they meet.



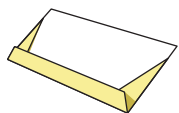
5. Keeping the plane folded, fold down the top wing about 3/4 inch from the center fold.



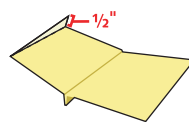
2. Make a 3/4-inch fold on the bottom edge.



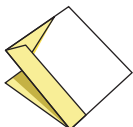
6. Flip the plane over so your beginning folds are faceup and repeat step 5 with the other wing.



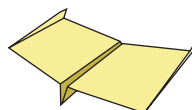
3. Repeat step 2, folding up the bottom 7 more times.



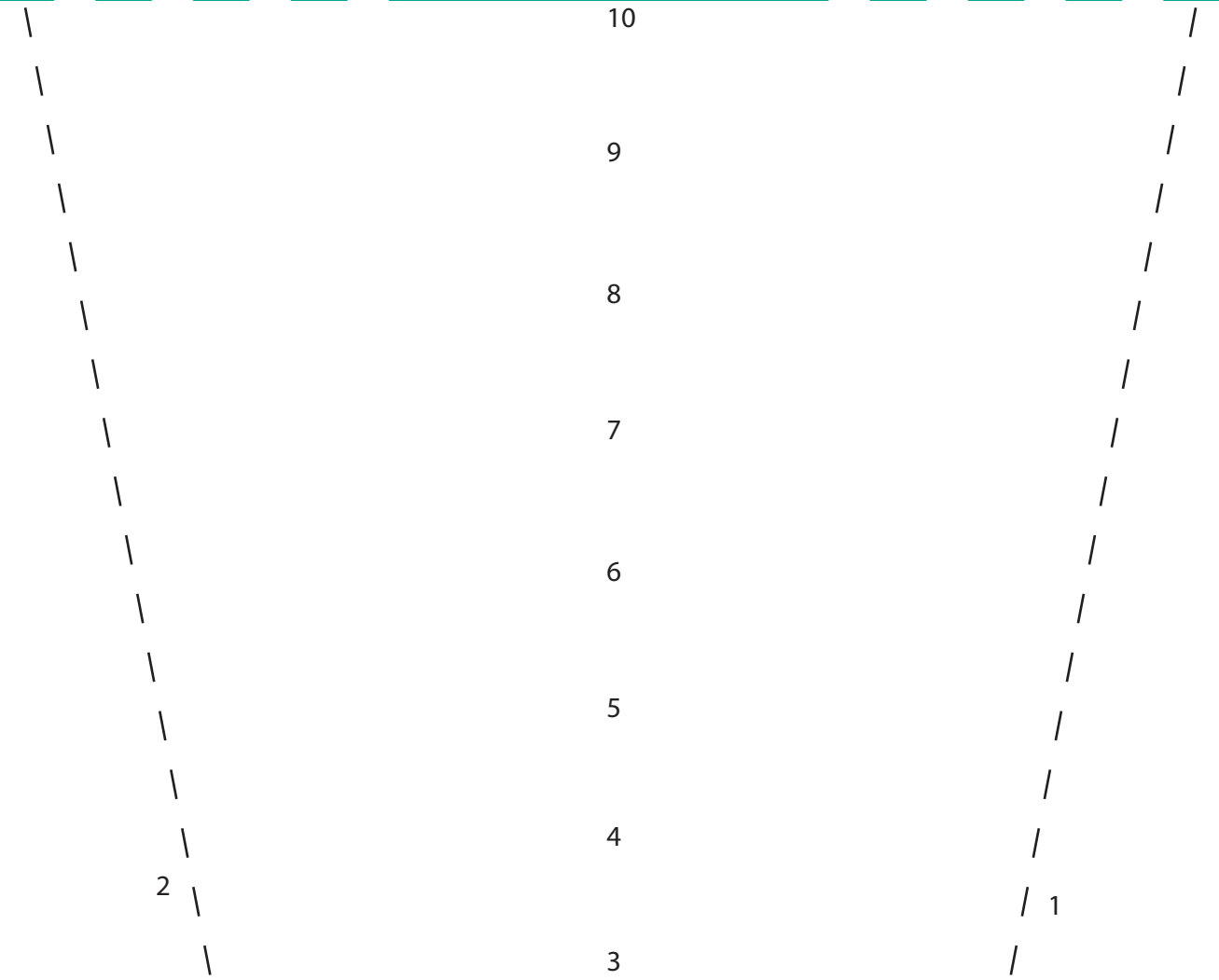
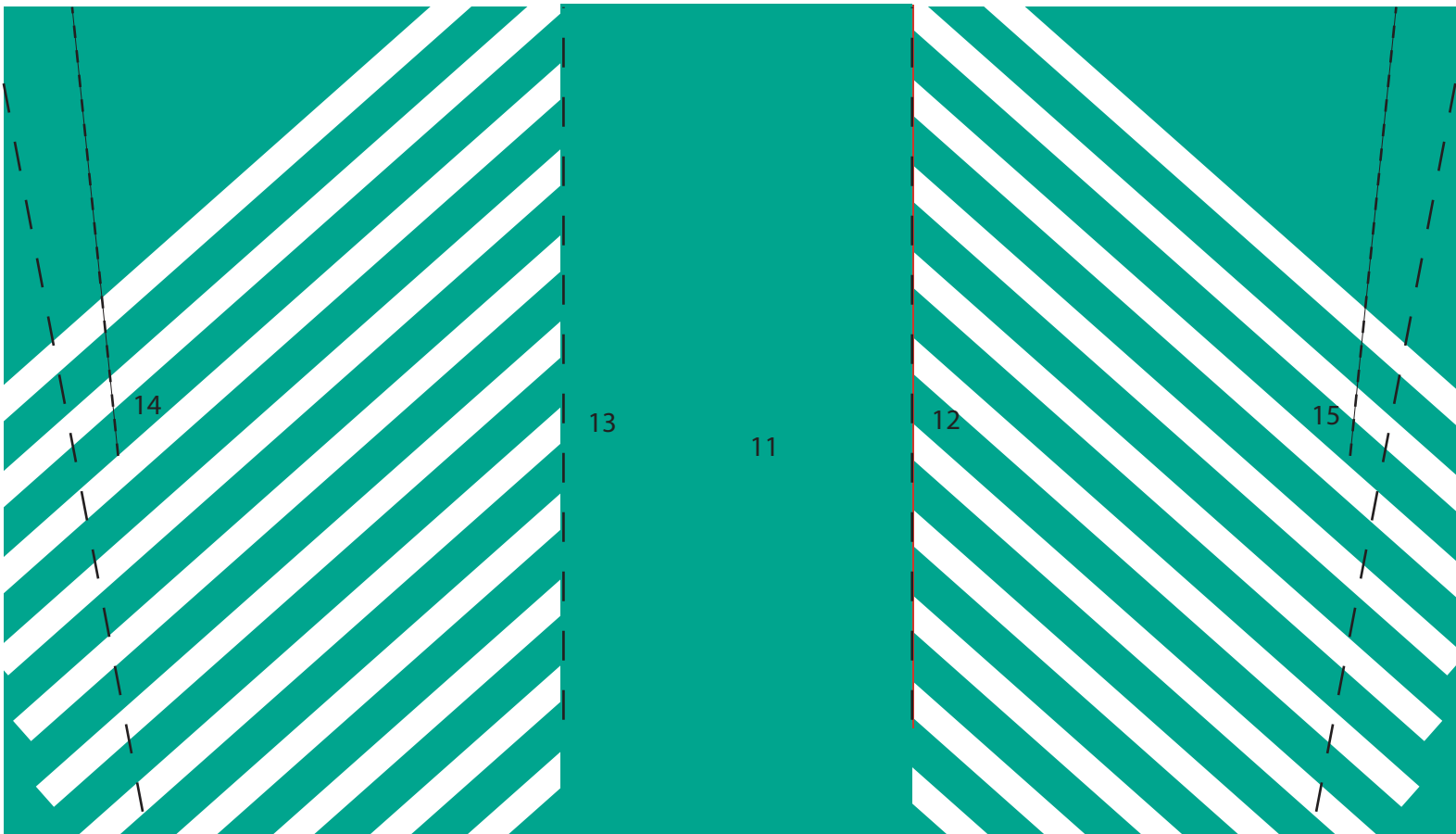
7. Flip the plane over again so that the folds are facedown, then fold up the edge of each wing tip about 1/2 inch.



4. Flip the plane over so that the folds are facedown, then fold the whole plane in half.



8. To launch your plane, throw it overhand and straight up in the air. Have a great flight!

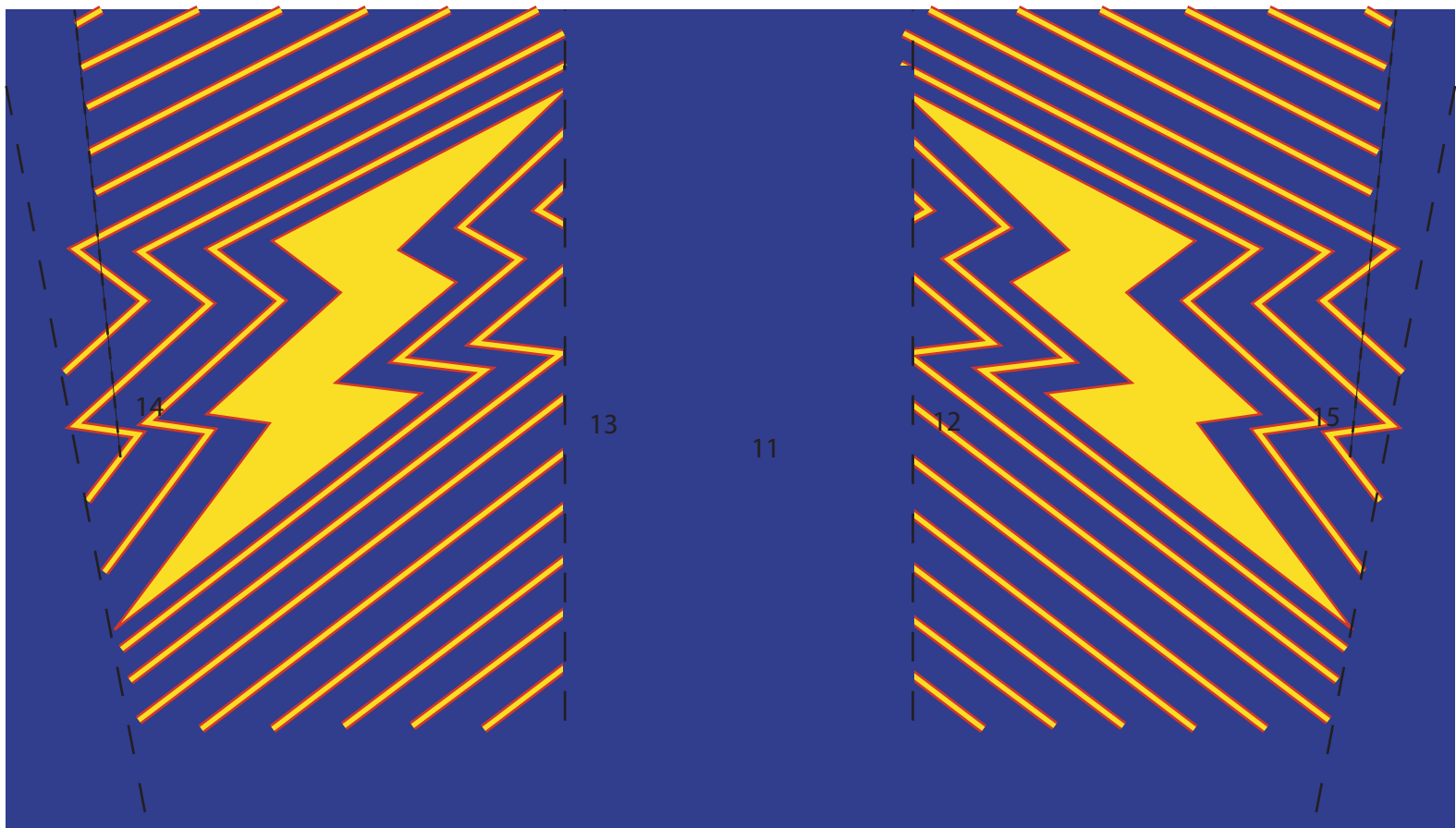
