

! Local Flavor**Pennsylvania's Bucks County****Washington Crossing Historic Park.**

Stroll the grounds where the Continental Army camped before setting off to brave the Delaware River that stormy Christmas night in 1776. Don't miss the reenactment of the Crossing, which occurs every year at 1 p.m. on Christmas Day. At this event, reenactors in Continental military dress cross the river in Durham boat replicas. \$1 parking fee. Refreshments served. Call (215) 493-4076.

Bowman's Hill Tower.

At the 80-acre Bowman's Hill State Wildflower Reserve, families can take guided tours of a forest and meadows teeming with indigenous plant life and search for turtles around a creek. After a brief elevator ride, squeeze your way up spiral stairs to the top of this 100-foot tower built in 1930 on the site of a former Continental Army lookout post. Call (215) 493-4076. The Tower is open May through October. Admission is \$5 for adults, \$4 for seniors, and \$2 for children ages 6 to 12.)
